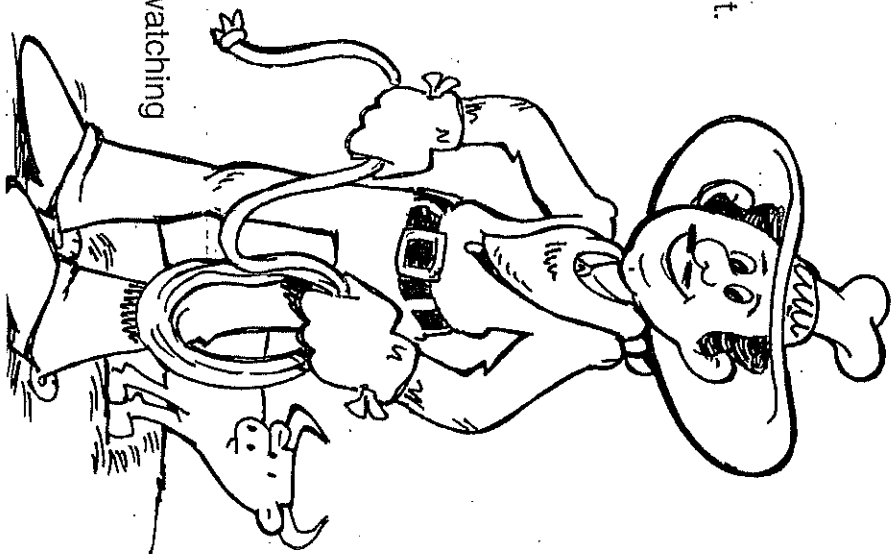


## Bill Pickett

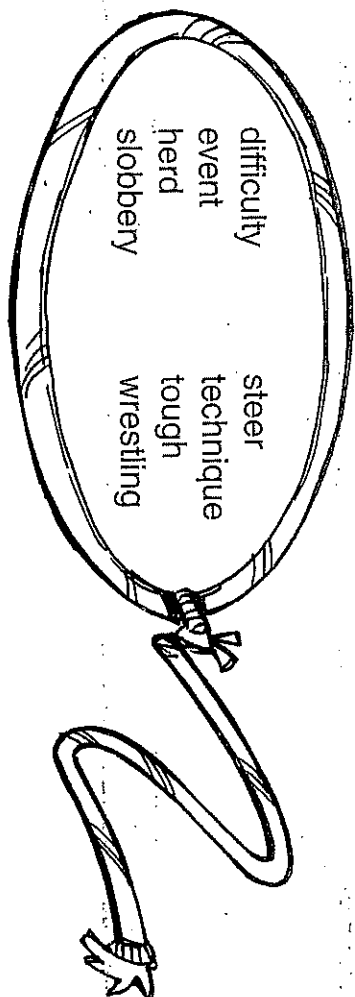

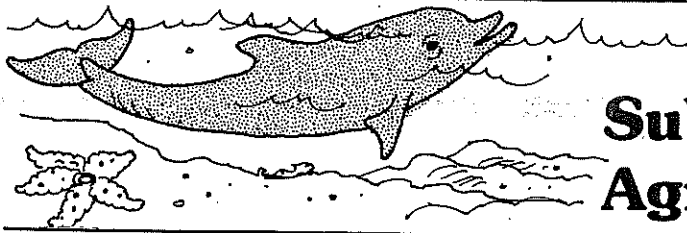
